Conference location: CCE1 – Harvard Lecture Theatre

The conference will be held on City Campus East (postcode: NE2 1XA) in CCE1 (as above). The lecture theatre is on the 4th floor (there are lifts), where there is a quiet space (room 416), toilets, and areas to relax.


Thursday Social: The Journey Café Bar Higham House, New Bridge St W, Newcastle upon Tyne NE1 8AN

There will be a break for dinner before the social zine/book fair. Recommended restaurants close to the hotel: Pani's Café (Italian), The Journey (vegan), Dabawwal (Indian), Tyneside Cinema Café, Lady Greys (pub food), Sushi Me Rollin'. The Ouseburn is a 15-minute walk from the evening venue with The Tanner's Arms (pub food), Scream for Pizza, Ernest's (cafébar), The Ship Inn (vegan).
